

Accessible Trauma Counseling for Sexual Assault Survivors with I/DD (July 2020)

PRODUCED BY THE ARIZONA SEXUAL VIOLENCE & I/DD RESPONSE COLLABORATIVE

Sexual assault can have profound impacts on a person's emotional, physical, social, and sexual health. People with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) are seven times more likely than the general population to be sexually assaulted in their lifetimes. With the increased risk of sexual assault in this population, the Trauma-Informed Access workgroup of the Arizona Sexual Violence & I/DD Response Collaborative wanted to determine availability of trauma therapists who work with this population to promote healing and well-being following sexual assault.

Workgroup members contacted counseling agencies across the state to assess whether they provided trauma-informed counseling to people with I/DD. In this search, trauma-informed counseling is defined as therapeutic interventions that specifically address the emotional aftermath of a traumatic event, such as sexual assault. Examples of this intervention include trauma-focused cognitive-behavioral therapy and eye movement desensitization and reprocessing therapy (EMDR). We did not include Applied Behavioral Analysis (ABA) in this definition, as ABA focuses on behavior changes and symptom management rather than the emotional processing of a traumatic situation.

Agencies were contacted via phone and email regarding whether they provide trauma-informed counseling, accept AHCCCS (i.e., Arizona's Medicaid agency), and work with the I/DD population. Work group members also contacted victim service providers such as community-based sexual assault programs and child and family advocacy centers to determine if they provide counseling on-site with this population and/or agencies they refer survivors to for trauma-informed counseling. Finally, the workgroup members contacted healthcare providers, including behavioral health providers, integrated care clinics, intensive outpatient services, and community agencies.

Of the 146 agencies and individuals contacted, 90 agencies provided information. Of the 90 that responded, only 26 confirmed that they have trauma-informed counselors on site that work with the population of people with I/DD and that accept AHCCCS and/or have Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) funding to provide this service free of charge. Importantly, these agencies are often in urban areas. Agencies often cited a lack of available training on providing counseling services with this population as a barrier to providing services.

The following agencies have confirmed providing counseling services for individuals with (I/DD) after sexual assault. They also accept AHCCCS or have VOCA funding:
