Domestic violence is a pattern of coercive control and abusive behaviors in any intimate or familial relationship that are used to gain and maintain power and control over another.

Domestic violence can look many different ways, including:

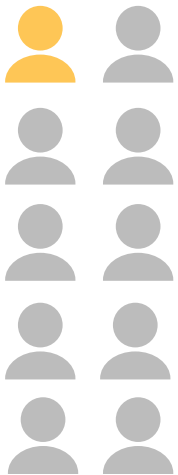


PREVALENCE

1 in 4 women



1 in 10 men



were victims of contact sexual violence, physical violence, and/or stalking by an intimate partner.

UNMET NEEDS

In one day in 2017, victims in AZ made 366 requests for services that went unmet due to lack of program resources.

Of these requests, **74%** were for housing

CHILD IMPACT

Individuals who witnessed IPV as children are **2x** more likely to become either victims or perpetrators of IPV

Economic Impact

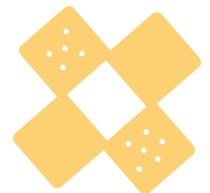
The lifetime cost of IPV per female and male victim is about **\$104,000** and **\$23,000**, respectively.
